An apparatus invented by Wirth and located in the baggage car, instantly sets the brakes by a wireless signal from the dispatcher's office. Williams was mentioned in connection with the disappearance of the launch Witch from this port last year, but charged that the owner knew he was going and wanted him to take the launch and engage in the Chinese smuggling trade.
